To meet the people who buy my work, and to develop a rapport with them, Amy and I felt it critical that we open our own gallery in Scottsdale.

My interests and hobbies: Aviation, traveling, composing music and poetry, collecting rare and worthwhile books and art.

The trait(s) I admire in others: What I like most about what I The fundamental measures of all

people are their faith, their integrity and their skills. Only integrity remains constant in an individual's life. From integrity comes a pantheon of human virtues: modesty, honesty, insight, dignity, respect, leadership and fairness. Without integrity, the rest are impossible.

People who inspired me (and how): Generally, those who find creative solutions to life's adversities inspire me. Historically, one of my favorite figures was Galileo, who persevered in his quest for the truth long after he was forced to recant his discovery that the sun, not the earth, is the center of the solar system. In my own life, my maternal grandfather inspired me by never wavering from his vision, and his housekeeper inspired me: her decency and compassion toward other people never deviated despite her own very modest circumstances.
